## **BIOGRAPHY**

Matt Aasen is a musician and educator from Vancouver Island, whose passion for teaching and performance brought him to the University of Toronto in order to pursue his greater academic goals. With a mix of jazz standards and original tunes modelled after music from the great American songbook, Matt hopes to invite the listener in with musical conversation, humour, and fun.
